# **Student Internship Opportunities**

#### **Marian Drane Graham Scholars**

This six- week immersive and experiential summer program is designed to provide students the opportunity to develop leadership skills and gain a better understanding of key issues facing public higher education. The program is open to rising juniors and seniors attending one of the sixteen constituent institutions of higher education in the University of North Carolina system. Scholars will be mentored by UNC leadership, spend time in the UNC General Administration offices in Chapel Hill, NC, travel to UNC campuses, visit with key NC policy leaders and elected officials in North Carolina and Washington, DC. The application deadline is Friday, February 2, 2018.

#### **Presidential Scholars**

The Presidential Scholars program, formerly known as the Presidential Interns, is open to December 2017 and May 2018 graduates. The Presidential Scholars serve a one year appointment and provide a wide range of professional functions for UNC General Administration. With access to high ranking university officials, scholars have the opportunity to explore and understand the inner workings of an institution that has transformed North Carolina's economy and is critical to our state's future. The position will have regular interaction with senior leadership and members of the Board of Governors and will work to research, write, and implement policy. While there are daily responsibilities, Presidential Scholars are frequently presented with unique opportunities and it is expected that they be willing to assume additional projects as they arise. The application deadline is Wednesday, January 31, 2018.
