Brown Receives Emerging Leader Award

Dr. Heather Brown, Executive Director of the [Women + Girls Research Alliance](#) at UNC Charlotte, is the 2018 recipient of the National Women's Studies Association's Emerging Leader Award (NWSA). The NWSA Emerging Leader Award recognizes an individual new to the field of Women's/Gender Equity who has demonstrated extraordinary dedication to

the issues that affect women on campus, in their community or globally. Dr. Brown facilitated The Story of the Charlotte Girl, a series of lectures and intellectual engagement that culminated in the 2018 Women's Summit on campus in April 2018. The summit focused on the following crucial fields related to improving the lives of women and girls in the Greater Charlotte region: employment and earnings, civic and political engagement, economic security, health and well-being, and violence against women.
