CTI Accepting Faculty Proposals for 2019 Seminars



Calling all UNC Charlotte professors! <u>Charlotte Teachers Institute</u> (CTI), an educational partnership with Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS), UNC Charlotte, and Johnson C. Smith University, is accepting faculty proposals for 2019 seminars. University faculty lead a seminar of 13 CMS teachers over the course of seven months. Teachers, known as Fellows, write original curricula which they teach to their students. To date, more than 450 CMS teachers in grades P-12 have completed seminars led by 60 university faculty, teaching more than 103,000 students. Proposals will be shared with the Teacher Steering Committee, made up entirely of CMS teachers, for feedback. Deadline to <u>submit a proposal</u> is September 3, 2018. Unless a Foreign National holds a valid EAD card or is a Legal Permanent Resident (aka Green Card holder) and he or she will be employed by the University for the first time, attendance at one of the I-9 sessions is mandatory before employment can begin. Due to volume and other commitments around International Student Orientation, the International Student and Scholar Office (ISSO) will NOT accept anyone for "walk-in" I-9 on either Wednesday, August 8 or Wed, August 15.
