Phi Kappa Phi Fellowship Program Expansion

Phi Kappa Phi has <u>announced an expansion</u> of its Fellowship Program from a total distribution of \$345,000 each year to \$615,000. The funding will support 58 fellowships for students entering their first year of graduate or professional study. Beginning in 2019, Phi Kappa Phi will award 50 fellowships at \$8,500 each, six at \$20,000 each, and two at \$35,000 each. These Fellowships are part of the Society's <u>award program</u> which distributes nearly \$1 million each year through study abroad grants, fellowships, funding for post-baccalaureate development, and more. Applications will open December 15.

CONNECT Training and Early Alerts

Numerous CONNECT training sessions are scheduled for Fall 2018. These training sessions will include Early Alert Training. Early Alerts are due for all 1XXX/2XXX courses by noon on Friday, September 14th. Incentive Program Pays Doctoral Students to Apply for Fellowships

Doctoral students can get \$500 for applying for qualified fellowships this year. The payment is part of the Graduate School's Fellowship Application Incentive Program (FAIP) to encourage more students to apply for fellowships in the 2018-19 academic year. Through FAIP, an incentive program launched last year, doctoral students can get \$500 each for applying for up to two qualified fellowships. An additional \$1,500 incentive payment is available for the first successful fellowship application. To apply, doctoral students complete the FAIP application prior to applying for fellowships. Application deadline is February 1, 2019. An application form and more details are located on the Graduate School's Funding webpage. Workshops are available to help locate fellowship opportunities. The Graduate School's Center for Graduate Life will host a workshop, "Money for your Graduate Education: How to Find Fellowships" on September 17 and September 28. Ventureprise Launch Fall NSF I-Corps

Have an idea or research finding that the National Science Foundation may be interested in Funding? Apply to participate in the fall 2018 Ventureprise Launch National Science Foundation I-Corps cohort. The program provides UNC Charlotte faculty, staff and students with commercialization training and an initial \$3,000 in NSF funding. The goal of the program is to identify potential commercial uses and prepare for more substantial commercialization funding opportunities. The next stage is a six month \$50,000 NSF I-Corps Teams grant. Applications are due September 14; the cohort begins September
