Ventureprise Launch NSF I-Corps Fall 2019 Cohort - Now Accepting Applications

Are you interested in receiving up to \$5000 in funding to expand your research and look into possible commercial possibilities? Apply to participate in the Fall 2019 Ventureprise Launch National Science Foundation I-Corps cohort. The program provides UNC Charlotte faculty, staff and students with commercialization training and up to an initial \$5000 in NSF funding. The goal of the program is to identify potential commercial uses and prepare for more substantial commercialization funding opportunities.
