Catalog and Fall 2020 Registration Deadline Approaching



If you're looking to make changes to the Undergraduate or Graduate Catalog, please note that October 31 is the strongly recommended deadline for 'Course Revision' proposals to be launched and approved by the Originator via Curriculog (Course and Curriculum Deadlines). The earlier you start, the more likely the proposal will reach final approval in time for Fall 2020 implementation, registration, and publication in the 2020-2021 Catalogs.

The working drafts for the 2020-2021 <u>Undergraduate</u> and <u>Graduate</u> Catalogs are available online for preview to help with planning your course and curriculum changes for the 2020-2021 academic year. These previews should reflect any course and curriculum changes that have gone through the full approval process within Curriculog. Any proposals that have not yet gone through the full approval process will not yet appear. Future changes will be added to these working drafts of the catalogs as proposals have completed the FULL approval cycle within Curriculog.
