## **Conflict Resolution Training for Administrators**

The responsibilities of academic administrators include managing conflicts from a variety of areas — faculty, staff, students, and peers. Dr. Vivian Lord, who is a certified mediator and with more than ten years of chair experience from two colleges and four departments, will provide four-hours of conflict resolution training that will enhance participants' skills in conflict management and resolution. Using relevant academic conflict situations, the participants will learn reframing; principled negotiation and communication skills; and conflict resolution styles and techniques. This is an opportunity for administrators to improve their skills in one of the more stress-inducing administrative responsibilities. The workshop, being organized by the Faculty Ombuds Office and sponsored by the Office of the Provost, will be held January 7, 8:30 - 12:30; lunch will be provided.
