Digital Course Enhancement Resource Collections Launch Date

The University of North Carolina (UNC) System, through the efforts of almost 70 faculty and staff, will soon deliver digital course resource collections aligned with ten high-demand courses. This will support faculty and universities across the UNC System, as we continue to offer online instruction during the summer and prepare for Fall 2020. These educational resources will be available the week of June 30, 2020. The ten course collections support Accounting 1, Anatomy & Physiology, Biology 1, Calculus 1, Chemistry 1, Chemistry 2, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Organic Chemistry 1, and Statistics (Intro). The guiding framework in the development of these resources for the above courses is to:

- Focus on a targeted list of high-demand courses that are common across many institutions with large enrollment numbers;
- Bring together small teams of top faculty, librarian, and instructional design talent within the UNC System to develop a library of content and digital resources that faculty can use to enhance and improve their online or face-to-face courses;
- To the extent possible, provide open educational resources.

Ignite Planning Grants: COVID-19 Flash Grant Request for Proposals

The School of Data Science and Research and Economic Development are pleased to announce a special call of the Ignite Planning Grants Program for investigators who wish to prepare proposals that respond to funding opportunities associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. Ignite planning grants are intended to enhance existing areas of excellence, accelerate the development of emerging research strengths, and foster interactions between UNC Charlotte faculty and potential collaborators at other institutions. The COVID-19 Flash Grants are intended to support and incentivize stronger collaborative relationships among researchers from different colleges and disciplines with the goal of positioning teams to be able to respond to new, external funding opportunities related to COVID-19.

Faculty and staff teams can apply for one-time grants of between \$5,000-\$10,000 for 3-6 months. Teams that engage with one of our [University Business Partners](#) will be eligible for an additional \$5,000, for a total of up to \$15,000. Flash Grant proposals will be accepted on a rolling basis between May 1 and September 1, 2020. We anticipate being able to complete the review of proposals within three weeks of submission. Therefore, PIs should anticipate a project start date that is one month from the date of submission. Visit this [site](#) for complete submission details for the COVID-19 Flash Grants.
